The teaching of Civic education has become compulsory by Law No. 92 of 20 August 2019 since school year 2020/2021

The idea was launched in 2015 by the plan for national digital development of Italian schools (PNSD)

A survey on "Teens and social media"

- the increasing number of children (60%) who get their first smartphone when they are 10; and 28% of them before the age of
- 54% of kids between 11 and 12 are on social network; 12% become social users before the age of 10
- 47% of kids lie about their age for registration; 23% declares they are over 18. There is no absolute certainty of their real age





In Italy: A Law for Minors

The aims:

- to prevent online
- to protect the minors
- to educate students
- to ensure immediate actions against criminals
 - The law makes cyberbullying a criminal offence



- Cyber bullies and online stalkers could face between one and six years in prison
- Victims who are at least 14 or parents can apply to the privacy guarantor (The Italian Data Privacy Authority) to demand host websites the removal of hurtful content within 48

STOP Cyberbullying

- Most initiatives are focused on cyberbullying
- 2) The law No. 71 /2017 is the landmark for school policy against cyberbullying
- 3) It came into force after years of legal battles and campaigns of families of victims of online bullying
- 4) Elena Ferrara is a teacher and Senator and wrote the first draft



Law 71/2017: Duties for schools

- The law requires each school to draft cyberbullying policies and establish methods for students to report cyberbullying anonymously
- Schools appoint a dedicated 'anti-bullying' teacher, responsible for informing the families of all those involved in cases of bullying
- The appointed staff member assigned to tackling cyberbullying takes part in a teacher training course concerning law 71/2017
- Activities are held in the school pursuing three main objectives: knowledge and therefore prevention of the phenomenon, analysis of the phenomenon, personal reflections
- Cyberbullying guidelines will be updated every two years by the education ministry to keep up to date with the rapidly evolving social media landscape.




Sexting


